If the area that you are outfitting is in direct sun you should consider adding a shade source like an umbrella, garden canopy, or shade sail. Not only will this provide relief from the blistering sun while you're enjoying your patio it will also help protect your patio furniture from the sun as well. The sun can fade your cushions and warm certain furniture materials when exposed for long periods of time making it uncomfortable to sit in.
